The Department of the Built Environment at the Cape Peninsula University of Technology (CPUT) is hosting a one-day symposium focusing at Public-Private Partnerships (PPPs). PPPs are popular ways of ensuring appropriate service delivery and provision of infrastructure around the world. In South Africa various PPPs were formed in recent years, and the numbers of these partnerships ensuring appropriate infrastructure and facilities serving the public is set to increase.

The symposium will see various national and international experts on various PPP aspects. The selected and invited speakers will bring together knowledge both from an academic as well as from the practitioner's points of view. Presentations range from conceptual approaches, fiscal considerations, to reports on actual projects in a case-study like fashion. The one-day symposium programme includes **9 presentations** of respective experts.
